Job Purpose

To participate in the inspection, service, repair, and maintenance of odour control equipment on various sites. To install and commission new equipment.

Key Tasks and Responsibilities

- You will be a key member of a small multi discipline team, working on a range of Odour Control Equipment on Sewage Treatment Works and Sewage Pumping Stations.
- You will inspect, fault diagnose, test, maintain, install, modify or repair as appropriate Mechanical equipment in a safe, efficient, timely and effective manner with minimum supervision.
- Maintain equipment to the required standard to ensure our statutory and contractual obligations are met and its availability and associated performance is maintained.
- Maintain and operate our Odour Control equipment and also be required to carry out marker compound gas testing and air flow sampling whilst onsite.
- Ensure all operational assets are accurately registered & have the correct strategic maintenance programme aligned to them (e.g. PPM, CBM, hours-run, etc.), ensuring optimal availability & resilience.
- Assist with delivery, offloading, inspection, storage, timely off-hiring and collection of hired plant.
- Ensure all key site based and contractual information is up to date & accurately captured / issued.
- Always work to approved RAMS.
- To work as part of a small team to carry out all aspects of the planned and reactive maintenance on sewage treatment Odour Control Equipment, pumps, fans, ductwork, pipework and instrumentation.
- Carrying out mechanical installation work at a variety of water or wastewater locations throughout the UK involving a number of different processes.
- Carrying out inspections and site testing of installations to check compliance with current Standards and Regulations.
- Carry out maintenance and fault finding complying with current Standards and Regulations.

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- Providing technical advice to update best practice and contribute towards strategic operational maintenance plans and task specifications.
- Complete operational reports and S&M Reports which also include any faults or failings that could affect the optimum efficiency of the odour equipment.
- Be prepared to work overtime in the event of an emergency or if the operational environment requires.
- Working closely with clients, colleagues and suppliers to ensure all maintenance is carried out with the least possible downtime and within budget.
- Ensure compliance with Health & Safety Policy at all times and demonstrating a Zero Compromise attitude towards Health, Safety and Wellbeing.
- Complete service records and reports in a timely manner.
- Ensure excellent customer service at all times.

Skill Set

- You will have basic literacy and numeracy skills plus the completion of NVQ in Mechanical Engineering.
- A proven track record and technical hands-on field experience in the maintenance, diagnostic, investigation of mechanical/electrical faults and problems, ideally with some experience in waste water equipment.
- General computer skills / IT literate with experience in computer data input and enquiry.
- Physically fit and able to be trained in safety procedures including confined space entry.
- A clean driving license.
- Active listening. Give full attention to what the people are saying, taking time to understand the points being made and ask questions as appropriate.
- Communicate effectively in writing as role requires.
